

Using Precision at the Sunshine State Game Sport Shooting Championships

The Wyoming Antelope Club hosted the Sunshine State Games - Precision Pistol Championship, on Sunday, November 7, in Clearwater, for the third year. The match was held under sunny skies with starting temperatures in the 60s before warming into the mid-70s. It was a beautiful day to be outdoors and active.

Precision Pistol shooting, formerly known as Conventional Pistol, but commonly called Bullseye was originally developed to provide a level playing field between the civilian shooter generally using a .22, a police officer generally using a .38, and the soldier's .45. In its current form the competitor fires 30 shots in groups of ten shots in 10 minutes - one handed, at a target 50 yards away. Then the competitor fires 60 shots in 5 shot groups at 25 yards. Half of those groups are shot at a target that faces the shooter for 20 seconds, the remainder on targets that face for only 10 seconds.

After a short break the process repeats in the next higher caliber. By the end of the competition 270 shots have been fired, each worth up to 10 points making the best possible score 2700. Within the 10 point scoring ring is a smaller X ring. The X count is used to break ties. In its long history, there has been no official score higher than 2680.

Tim Goszka, the defending champion, from Sun City Center, retained his title with a score of 2517. This year Tim swept the .22, center fire and .45 matches. Keith Fredriksen, of Venice, took silver overall shooting 2428. Gary Monti, from Tampa, won the Bronze medal firing 2411.

This year a 22-Only division was added allowing shooters to fire the 270 shots with just a .22 caliber pistol. Valrico's Lou Kapp won that distinction with a score of 2441.

Additional medals were awarded to the overall winners and class winners in each of the .22, center fire and .45 matches. The full match report follows on the next page.
